

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#### Sustrans - Big Walk and Wheel!

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It inspires pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in their neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world. Active travel is a great way to build physical activity into children's

daily routine. It helps them arrive to school more relaxed and alert and is great for their mental wellbeing too. This year the challenge will run from  $11^{th}-22^{nd}$  March. On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils walking, using a wheelchair, scooting or cycling to school. We will compete against other similar sized junior school's nationally and our best five days will determine our final position on the leader board!

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#### **Social Media and Internet Safety**

It is becoming and increasing concern across the year groups that children are more regularly exposed to social media and video content which is regarded as unsuitable for primary school age. Though our filtering system, Smoothwall, ensures Youtube, Veo and other video platforms, along with all social media sites are inaccessible to students, it is clear that these sites are accessed by many pupils regularly outside of school. We ask that parents undertake a regular check on social media and internet use to ensure access to undesirable and unsuitable content is restricted as much as possible.
